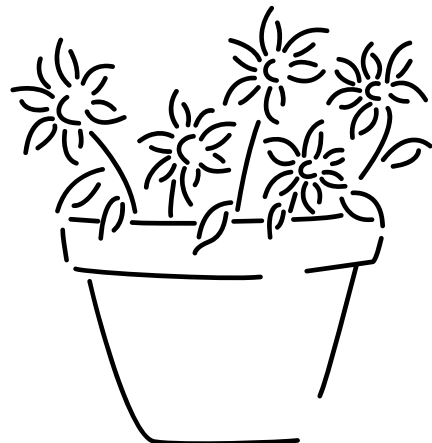

9. Two Courgettes (no longer than 6" including stalk)
10. Two Carrots with up to 3" foliage
11. Two Parsnips with up to 4" foliage
12. Six Pods of Peas
13. Four Onions grown from sets - dressed
14. One lettuce with roots (any variety)
15. Six Runner Beans
16. One Cucumber
17. One Cabbage with 3" stalk (red or green)
18. Three Beetroot with tops
19. Any other Vegetable not classified above
20. Mis-shaped Fruit or Vegetable
21. Tray of Five Vegetables (one of each kind). Tray 3ft x 2ft.  
(Exhibits must not be outside the board or have the leaves folded)
22. Dish or plate of Fruit, any variety or varieties

# SHOW RULES

1. The Show will be judged to The Royal Horticultural Society's standards **not including** the 2023 oasis ruling
2. The judging will commence at 11.30 a.m. and all exhibits must be staged by 11.15 a.m. No unauthorised persons will be allowed in the rooms while judging is in progress.
3. Each exhibitor will provide their own vase or bowl.
4. The decision of the judges will be final.
5. Protests must be lodged with the Secretary before 2.45 p.m. on the day of the show and be accompanied by a deposit of 50p, which will be returned if the protest is affirmed.
6. No prize cards or exhibits to be removed until after the presentation of trophies.
7. Exhibitors in the amateur gardeners Floral and Vegetable sections must have grown their own exhibits.
8. No professional grower is eligible to show in the amateur gardeners' section. For the purposes of this rule a professional is defined as a person who earns their livelihood in horticulture, either as a cultivator or as a retail or wholesale trader.
9. The Committee reserves the right to withhold any prize and cards where there is reason to believe that an exhibitor has not complied with the rules.
10. Staging will be allowed on the Saturday between 9.00 a.m. and 11.15 a.m.
11. All exhibits, personal property, etc., shall be at the risk of the exhibitors; and the Society shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
12. The Committee, together with its officers and servants shall not be responsible to any persons who are on the Committee's premises or who are entering or leaving the same. The Committee shall not be liable for any injury, fatal or otherwise, caused by any such persons.
13. No entries will be received after THURSDAY 27<sup>th</sup> AUGUST 2026.
